

TITLE: *On the Incarnation*

On the Incarnation is an important milestone in the development of Christology. St. Athanasius the Great, Archbishop of Alexandria, wrote his treatise in the fourth century as a defense against the Arian heresy that denied the divinity of Christ. The book begins with the Creation and explains the consequences of the Fall. It continues to explain how God the Son rescued mankind from sin and death by His Incarnation, Passion, and Resurrection. He continues to refute arguments brought forth against the Gospel by Jewish theologians and Greco-Roman philosophers during that time. *On the Incarnation* will provide the reader with a deep theological understanding of the Gospel message and the Bible as a whole. Additional features in this edition include an introduction from C.S. Lewis, the 20th century Anglican writer, and St. Athanasius' *Letter to Marcellinus on the Interpretation of the Psalms*.
